Carriage Shade Repairs: Council is going to patch up holes in the Carriage Shade this week where water comes in and drops on JCS 1007. They will patch the roof for the full length of the station and other work will be done in one of the rooms. A new PVC pipe which was fitted a few months ago has been leaking badly and this has to be looked at also.

Guinea Fowl: For quite a few years now a guinea fowl has been feeding on our car park lawns. ATHRA Alert: Draft National Code for Disability Access

The Rail Industry Safety and Standards Board (RISSB) recently released the draft National Code of Practice for Accessible Rail for review

and comment following the first draft in March 2010.

The objective of the Code that is to document solutions for independent access for people with disabilities to rail premises, infrastructure, rolling stock and communications. As this includes heritage rail operations the Code could ultimately have a significant impact upon our operations.

Safe Operation

The recent 7.1 magnitude earthquake and its aftershocks affected railway operations in New Zealand. KiwiRail Chief Executive Jim Quinn congratulated staff:

"Staff from all parts of the business pitched in and helped get the Christchurch network up and running again.
