## Neville Robertson-Hughes (1944 – 2011)

As well as working in Gladstone for Queensland Alumina and Queensland Rail, Nev was always interested in the history of the local area.

He was the founder of the Gladstone Maritime Museum, a Senior Volunteer at the Gladstone QR Interpretive Centre (opened in 2004) and designed and co-founded the current *Calliope River Railway* display at the *Port Curtis Historical Centre* (opened in 2010).

Nev also participated as a QR Heritage Volunteer on the *Q150 Steam Train Tours*, travelling from Rockhampton to Townsville.

He believed that museums were for sharing the beauty of objects that amaze and educate.

If faced with a challenge, his response was always *How difficult can it be!* 

Nev is survived by his partner Leonie, sons Adam and Andrew and daughter Roslyn.
