The Twilight Steam Train Adventure

Most of you know of QR's celebration of 150 years of rail with a beautifully restored train of steam loco and wooden carriages travelling the old Sunshine route up the coast.

For the Rockhampton visit Council offered APRM in early December the opportunity to organise a Twilight trip as a fundraiser for our restoration works. Our Coordinator jumped at the chance – thus our normally quiet December-January became a whirlwind of activity.

Janice led from the start – making the plan – organising sponsorship and media promotions – coordinating with QR and Council – taking bookings and selling tickets through the Museum. The help provided by our volunteers plus supporters from across the city and from OR was awesome.

This was the biggest and best event in the Museum's history and was popular with the community at large. All seats available on the steam train adventure were sold out in a couple of weeks.



The importance of the event was recognised in higher echelons – honoured guests on the train included our community leader, Mayor Margaret Strelow, and our representative in federal parliament, Michelle Landry.

So the exercise was a success – customers enjoyed the experience – the Museum was given tremendous promotion within the community – and APRM raised much needed funds.

The big lesson for us was how much can be achieved if we're positive and really go for it.

What a coincidence! Our old stalwart, Bill Head, volunteered to help on the Twilight Train in the Dining Car. It turned out that this car, now restored, was the one he served on nearly 70 years ago as a junior Railway employee. The ABC reporter captured the story.

Heritage Grant

More good news for APRM came from the Department of Environment and Heritage Protection. We have been awarded a substantial portion of the grant monies we applied for some time ago. This funding will allow the upgrade of our soundscape which is to be done by contractor.

Another important event is our first Family Fun Day for the year – on Sunday 1 March. We'll be contacting all the usual suspects to ensure we have a full roster of volunteers for the various tasks.

With this publicity we have had lately it should be a good day.

Rollingstock

The Purrey Tram and Billard Loco Tractor were stood down in December for their annual inspection, certification of boiler, repairs and servicing. All went well and the first running day for 2015 was Sunday, 25 January. The crews were happy with their performance.

Unfortunately restoration works proposed on the Purrey (mainly painting) have not yet been done, but will be in the coming weeks.

Training

Training our tram crews for Advanced Boiler Tickets started with a weekend in Mackay on 17/18 January. There will be a further weekend training in Mackay on 21/22 February followed by examination and assessment on 17/19 April in Rockhampton.

It is fairly heavy going for "old" brains but we'll get there.
