# **President's Report**

The Coordinator, Janice Seymour, and our Secretary, Peter Allen, attended the Queensland Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards on 22 November 2016 at the Redland Performing Arts Centre. Archer Park Rail Museum received the award for Organisations – Volunteer Run – in the Sustainability Category. I'm sure all the members and staff will be pleased to receive this recognition for all their hard work over the past 2 1/2 years.

The 'Friends' Christmas party is to be held at the Bluebirds Sports Club, Richardson Road, on Saturday 3 December with a 1pm sit down. Don't forget the multi-draw raffle.

NEATO has been very busy over the last couple of months. Under the supervision of John Kennedy, Track Supervisor, they have laid around 60 sleepers on the main track, as well as a new section of concrete at the Cambridge Street end of the platform and laying the new track for CWM21. The maintenance of the gardens is a big job as well as general yard work.

CWM21 was lifted from its position so two new sections of rail line could be chemset to the concrete, then returned back onto the new rail line. Work will now continue with the restoration of the carriage.

Ricky and Rob have been painting section cars and are nearly finished and they look great – well done guys!

RRC is working on the refurbishment of the Board Walk - this is part of our heritage listing, and originally went across the rods that changed the track. It goes across the concrete apron out

The coverings over the tubes and boiler will be removed and some preparation work done in readiness for the tram's yearly boiler maintenance and inspection. Hopefully if all maintenance work is completed the tram will be ready to operate again late January 2017.

## **Rollingstock Supervisor's Report**

The repacking of the tram boiler indicator lever has been successful with no water or steam leaks visible. A raft of other maintenance items has been compiled for the tram and the Billard Loco tractor to be done over the shutdown period.

The warning horns on the tram failed to operate on a Sunday. When inspected we found that the wiring to the horns and the revolving lights was faulty, the RRC fitter has replaced all wiring with a heavier duty cable and all are now working ok.
