We have started putting our new signage up around Rockhampton. We have 3 new signs and 1 old one; they are a bit bigger than poster size and will go up on the way into Rockhampton from the south, on Lakes Creek Road, Glenmore Road and near Bunnings to the North.

The Occupational Skills Centre Australia -Training Group continues to be part of the station, coming 2 weeks on and 2 off. It's great to have a railway group in the station learning to do track work. This venue hire also continues to bring in revenue which helps us with costs of operating the Museum.

Safety Officer's Report

I hope this newsletter finds you well and safe. Due to an urgent family matter I have had to return home to North Eastern Thailand at short notice. However with today's technology I am still able to do live video feeds of any meetings, review Safety Management Systems documentation, etc., while I am away. I am also just an email away if you wish to contact me.

I would like to remind tram crew to keep an eye out for any passengers that may decide to stand while the tram is in motion, exit the tram when points are being changed or exit while stationary (Fitzroy or Albert Street ends) preparing for the return run along Denison.

Passengers are to remain seated and on the tram at all times unless specifically instructed otherwise by tram crew.

It is important to notify the Coordinator when we are leaving the museum, including at the end of the day. This is important so that in an emergency we know exactly who is at the museum for evacuation purposes.

Please, I want to stress the importance of wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). My wife is a Senior Medical Nursing Practitioner and this past week I have watched her attending to up to 6 serious foot injuries per day, plus injuries such as deep lacerations to the arm for workers not wearing appropriate PPE.

I want to thank everyone at the museum for their diligent effort they give in this matter but let's not let complacency set in.

If you notice any faulty or damaged equipment please report it immediately to the Coordinator, President or Vice President/Rolling Stock Supervisor to have it repaired or replaced.
