It was very exciting to finally get the new stand to display our Qld Gallery and Museum Achievement Award for Sustainability that we won in 2016. It is now on the shelf in the Refreshment Room where everyone can see it!!

August had highest amount of visitors since 2013 with 1040 people through the door in the Month!! Our promotions are working.

Our Signal Masts are now refurbished and up and looking great! Our boys took the signal arms and lights off, then repainted and refurbished
