Visitor Statistics

At the end of October we had recorded around 1,100 people fewer through the doors than at the same time last year. We had a big and fast influx for the first couple of months after we opened again, helped by the paid advertising through

the *Adapt Grant*, but as the weather warmed up the visitors to the Museum have again slowed down.

Volunteers

Our *Small Projects Grant* to advertise for more volunteers has been very successful. Richard, Anthony, Jean and Janet have started with us in various positions, and this will make a big difference to the workload of the few that have been here during the Covid-19 period. Great to have you on board!!

Thanks must go to Dennis Sheehan for working hard to assist with all the public enquiries about rail history. He is kept busy making phone calls, emails and research to answer all the questions asked of us.

Covid-19

We have all been learning how to deal with our visitors and operations in a Covid Safe way. The most recent update of easing of restrictions means that we are going on 1 person per 2 square metres rather than the previous restriction of only 50 persons in a Museum.

This means that whilst now our visitors are lower, as it is our non-peak period, we can have around 135 persons on the Museum platform and will be able to have a lot more visitors in the Museum for any event we might plan!!

Bitumen of Car Park

The Rockhampton Regional Council has plans to bitumen our car park from the start of February 2021 and it will take around 6 weeks. This will make it really easy to get in and out of the car in the rain, and certainly present the Museum much better.

Rollingstock Maintenance

The Billard has been a problem this year, with the gearbox breaking down and a major gear breaking into 3 pieces (see photos). Now the wheels have not passed an inspection and we need to get them repaired to be "Fit for purpose". We are very appreciative to QR Maintenance at Gracemere for their assistance with this. To do the work on the Billard they had to use a crane to remove the Billard to the RRC Workshops.

Rail Safety Auditing

Thankfully the 2020 SMS and Document Review are finished for the year. I would like to thank the Management Team members, Tram Crew and Safety Officer for their assistance in getting this important work completed. With 114 APRM documents, around 70 of which are rail safety, as well as the 30 Element SMS Auditing process, it makes for a busy year for this work.

Collection Catalogue

We are currently doing a major audit of the Exhibit Catalogue, Paperwork Catalogue and Library to make sure they are correct and up to date. This entails many hours of checking the location of every exhibit piece to see if it is where it is supposed to be and tidying up any outstanding problems with the spreadsheets.

Grants

Unfortunately we were unsuccessful with our *Supplementary Volunteering Grant* – we were advised that there were so many applications and not enough funds to go around – maybe next time! We were also unsuccessful with the *Tackling Tough Times Together Grant* for the Camp Wagon Project.

We have just submitted a *BMD COVID-19 Recovery Community Assistance Program Grant*, applying for \$5,000 for advertising from January 2021.
